Parent-child Lunar New Year's Eve Carnival

Objective(s)

- Learn about the origins and customs of the Lunar New Year.
- Learn about Lunar New Year celebrations.
- Experience the festive atmosphere of Lunar New Year.

Brief Descriptions:

Through various Lunar New Year celebrations and traditional craft experiences, children can learn about Chinese culture and deepen their understanding of traditional festivals. As a result, children can recognize the identity of Chinese people. In addition, children learn to respect the culture of their country and nation through traditional etiquette, such as knowing that they are Chinese, the significance of the New Year, i.e., children have to thank their elders for their blessings, and to have a family reunion with their family members.

Lamp Guessing

In ancient times, riddles were written on slips of paper and pasted on lanterns for people to guess. Since riddles can increase wisdom and fit in with the festive atmosphere, they have become an indispensable activity of the Lantern Festival. In order to let children experience, we have set up riddle-guessing activities.



Spring Fling Production

The school believes that "experiential learning" is an important part of education and provides an activity-based teaching mode to enhance different learning experiences. In the Chinese Culture Programme, children can experience the importance of calligraphy through hands-on work. Teachers will also teach children the skills of holding brushes and ink during the creative process, train their small hand muscles together with them, inspire children's creativity, and encourage them to share their artwork with their peers, thus cultivating a sense of appreciation and respect for each other's character and morals.



Lantern Making

Origami is a traditional paper art popular in China, where an ordinary piece of paper is transformed into different three-dimensional works. In order to let children explore the art of Chinese paper, parents and children were invited to cut and fold red envelopes into different lanterns at home and display them in the lobby for appreciation.



Dragon and Lion Dance

Legend has it that on the last day of the year, the Lunar New Year beast will come to the village to catch the villagers and eat the vegetables they have grown, so the villagers will dance large dragons and lions to scare away the beast and protect the residents of the village. To this day, the dragon and lion dance is a Lunar New Year activity to celebrate the end of the old year and the beginning of the new year. Therefore, the school also takes this opportunity to let the children experience this custom.

The Chinese food culture is full of wonderful stories and legends. Through the snack stalls, children can experience the beauty of food and learn to treasure it by understanding how hard it is to come by. In addition, children will learn to share food with their carers and appreciate the love and care embedded in food.
