Auxiliary Services

Occasional Child Care Service

For parents or carers with sudden engagements or other ad-hoc issues, occasional child care service can be provided to avoid leaving children unattended.

Service Hours

- · Same as the Nursery School's service hours
- · Schools are closed on Sundays, public holidays, school holidays and Professional Development Days; please contact the school for further enquiries

Fee (stipulated by the Social Welfare Department)

\$16 per two-hour session (max. 4 sessions daily), plus \$6.5 for meal charge

- 3. Immediate acceptance of applications will be considered should there be any vacancies.

Extended Hours Service

To avoid children being left unattended at home, the school provides longer hours of childcare assistance to support working parents or other families in need.

Application Procedure

- 2. For service users who neither attend our schools nor use our occasional child care service, please bring the identity card(s) of the parent(s)/quardian(s) and the birth certificates(s) of the child. Both originals and photocopies are required.
- 3. Complete the application form.
- 4. If the application is accepted, admission documents have to be signed and payments for the extended service have to be settled in due course.

Verbal notification to the Principal is required

Integrated Programme

- · Children with special education needs (SEN) can be referred to the school by the Central Referral System for Rehabilitation Services of the Social Welfare Department.
- Teachers having received the training under the Integrated Programme can design an individualised learning plan for each referred student after consulting professional therapists. Training and care will also be provided to SEN students so that they can better adapt to society and mainstream education in the future.
- (This service shares the same service hours, fees, registration and withdrawal procedures with those of the daytime service.)

Admission •

School Fee

- 1. The amount of school fee is approved by the Government and adjusted annually every September. Please call the school for enquiries about the latest fee.
- 2. Our Schools are eligible for the Kindergarten Education Scheme. Families that request financial assistance may apply to the Student Finance Office for fee remission under the Kindergarten and Child Care Centre Fee Remission Scheme.

Application

- Application form can be obtained from the school directly or downloaded from the school's website. Please submit the completed application form along with the required supporting documents to the school by post or in person.
- All applicants will be notified by the school upon receipt of the application form.

Interview Arrangement

Based on the vacancy situation, the school will contact parents if an interview is offered for admission to the school. The purpose of the interview is to understand the development and living habits of the children, as well as the care provided by the family to the children.

Admission Criteria

- 1. Children aged 2 to 6 years old
- 2. Parents' recognition for the school vision and teaching style
- 3. Interview performance and a certification which proves the child is physically and mentally fit for schooling issued by a registered general practitioner
- 4. Preference will be given to the candidates with sibling(s) currently studying in our kindergartens, depending on their interview performance and the availability of vacancies
- 5. Preference will be given to the candidates with special reguests from their families, depending on their interview performance and the availability of vacancies
- *(Due to the limited vacancies, please understand that not all the candidates fulfilling the criteria for priority consideration will be guaranteed a school place)

Announcement of Admission Result

Parents will be informed of the admission result by post.

Registration and Admission Procedure

- 1. Provide health screening documents issued by a Registered General Practitioner.
- 2. For successful applicants, parents should complete the registration procedures at the designated date and time according to the notification of admission and registration. The registration procedures include submitting the original of children's registration certificates issued by the Education Bureau (except for N1 Class), and settling the registration fee*, school fee and other relevant charges. The registration fee will be refunded a month after the children's enrolment via autopay.
- 3. Parents should present the required admission documents, and read and sign consent on all official admission documents.
- * (Should parents decided to withdraw from school after registration, the registration fee will not be


Withdrawal
