**Parent-child Lunar New Year Fair & February Birthday Party**

**Objective(s)**

The activity aim to:

- Know more about the origins of Lunar New Year
- Introduce different traditional culture and Lunar New Year's Eve activity
- Feel the Lunar New Year festive atmosphere
- Know more about Chinese traditional art, sports and food
- Let parents and children enjoy the festival

**Brief Descriptions:**

The activity was held on the day before Lunar New Year's Eve, teachers, parents, and children all dressed in traditional Chinese costume to participate in the activity. The school's main entrance was adorned with Fai Chun. The outdoor areas, lobby and classroom were decorated with different Chinese New Year decorations to create a festive atmosphere for the new year.

The school had prepared different culture experiencing booths, such as 'Traditional Chinese Sports', 'Traditional Chinese Art' and 'Traditional Chinese Food'. All the booths were crowded with parents and children. The "Traditional Chinese sports" booth let parents and children to experience ancient Chinese sports activities and lion dance. The juggling tricks provided diabolo spinning, and plate spinning for parents and children to play. The children participated actively in the game "Mushe" (Chinese Fifteen-Pin Bowling). They would attempt to hit the wooden pins by rolling balls. The school provided props such as mini-lions, mini-dragons, and small gongs for the children. The lion dance

was the most popular among the props. Children were most interested in the role play of lion dancers, they would hold the mini-lion up their heads and perform the lion dance.

At the 'Traditional Chinese Art' Booth, parents and children created Chinese dough dolls and windmills. Children followed the instructor to make small dragons using clay and designed their own windmills with brushes and pastels. The children loved their own dough dolls and windmills and shared them with their parents.

At the 'Traditional Chinese Food' booth, both parents and children followed the instructor's guidance to make their own candy and coconut wrap. Furthermore, they were deeply attracted by the demonstration of making hand-made cotton candy (dragon's beard candy).

Parents and children appreciate the booths a lot. They enjoy the festive atmosphere and know more about the traditional Chinese culture through experiencing different activities.
